3.0 Ward 10 Priorities & Actions		
3.1 Ward 10 updates	<p><u>3.1 Community Safety</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Traffic Calming & Community Safety meeting was held on Feb 7 2023 with Traffic Department and Barrie Police Services. The summary spreadsheet prepared by the Advisory Council was shared. Staff are further reviewing our recommendations and collecting data as needed where additional safety measures were requested. Staff to add separate column outlining action and next steps for each recommendation identified. Once complete, this will be shared with Advisory Council. • Members reinforced the need for speed radar on Hurst drive • Members received update on issues across from High School in Hasty Market plaza. BPS was notified and has been working with the school and businesses and providing a regular presence during lunch hour. • Speed bumps to be distributed in Ward 10 in the Spring. Bryn will ask for list of past locations and bring back to Council members. Council members suggested creating a poll via social media to determine placement for speed bumps this year. <p><u>3.2 Infrastructure Investments</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hewitts Community Centre & Library forecasted to begin in 2024. Staff currently looking at possible parcels of land in South East Barrie. Members agreed land size to accommodate ancillary recreational activities (splash pad, sports dome, etc) would be great. Will continue to update members as discussions progress. • Barrie Soccer Club interested in possible dome location in south east Barrie. Proposal coming to identify land requirements. Members agreed that an indoor dome is best suited outside of a residential area. <p><u>3.3 Responsible Governance</u></p>	<p>Bryn to share staff's proposed actions for each recommendation present (end March)</p> <p>Advisory Council to create poll of possible locations via email (early April)</p>

Predominantly they have focused on snow removal and waste management services. The waste contract is set to expire and the city will be issuing an RFP for a new contractor in 2024. • Mission statement – Bryn to follow up with Peter re. draft mission statement for the advisory council <p><u>3.4 Affordable Place to Live</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NA <p><u>3.5 Thriving Community</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members agreed to participate in a ward 10 spring clean. Bryn will follow up with staff to confirm date and process for bags, tags, collection. Members agreed we should circulate newsletter 2 weeks prior to spring clean date to advertise. • Bryn has organized meeting with staff to review Hewitts secondary lands master plan in early April.
